Encouragement

Here are ways encouragement is happening in our classrooms.:

Mrs. Toterhi’s Class: “We have had a lot of discussions about ways to encourage each other so far this year, and being positive when other students participate and share, even if they get an answer wrong. Many students have been clapping, or saying Good job! when others share or participate.”

Mrs. Ebert’s Class: “Every morning we do a twenty second compliment share whole group. The students walk around at the carpet and give each other compliments. It’s a great way to start the day. I modeled different kinds of compliments before we did it as a whole group.”

Miss Limbert’s Class: “Students help each other by cleaning up spills, helping others with their learning, offer assistance with technology, and sharing supplies. They work well as a team.”

Mrs. Culp’s Class: “We recently read *The Dot*, by Peter R. Reynolds. After reading the story, we discussed how Vashti felt discouraged at the beginning of the story because she couldn’t draw. But, with a little encouragement from her art teacher, Vashti turned her dot in to something special. Not only did Vashti feel encouraged, but she passed her encouragement on to another boy at the art show who felt the same way Vashti did at the beginning of the story. We discussed how it only takes one person to make a huge difference.”

Miss Karr’s Class: “Every time one of our friends levels up, or achieves something in the classroom, the rest of the class does a cheer for them!”

Mrs. Kern’s Class: “In my classroom, we always do a morning chit-chat and math activity at the carpet. By doing this, students can encourage each other by offering positive feedback, providing help when other students struggle to answer, and sharing ideas during group work. When working off the board, we offer kind words of support, tell each other “Way to go friends” and celebrate each other’s successes when answering questions. These morning chats often generally create a positive and inclusive environment where everyone feels comfortable asking questions, getting help, and learning from one another.”

Mrs. Rockwood’s Class: “On their own, my class has started clapping for their classmates who receive Paw’s Laws on the morning announcements.”

Mrs. Sauer’s Class: “I have challenged my class to compliment one person each day, and then we share the compliments we’ve received at the end of each day. We are learning about what more meaningful compliments sound like. So instead of just saying “I like your shirt,” we might say “I like how you smile at me every day.”

Mrs. Graham’s Class: “During the announcements, we applaud the friends in our class who receive Paw’s Laws.”
